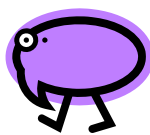

TAMS – Talent Acquisition Management Solution: online requisition and timesheet system for the University's Non-Student Hourly short-term staff

USP – Urban & Social Policy (SIPA concentration)

WEAI – Weatherhead East Asian Institute

FINANCIAL

ADDPAY – formerly termed Additional Compensation, service payments for monthly employees

AP/CAR – Accounts Payable Controlled Analytical Review – system formerly used for processing payments to vendors; replaced by ARC

ARC – Accounting and Reporting at Columbia – integrated, web-based system used for financial transactions and reporting

CASUAL– student employees hired on a short-term temporary basis and paid hourly on CU Casual payroll.

CHARTSTRING - are the combination of ChartFields and the level at which accounting charges and credits are applied. The ChartString is what is charged in ARC.

COA – Chart of Accounts

COB – Consolidated Operating Budget – accessed via ARC portal

COMBOCODE – is the 10-digit system-generated number representing a unique ChartString. Combo codes are used in PAC to assign labor charges.

COST TRANSFER – ARC Accounting transaction that allows for changes to employee salary distribution and transfer of expenditures retroactively

CROSSWALK – translation of a pre-ARC system value to a PeopleSoft value

DARTS – Departmental Advance Reporting and Tracking System – formerly used for creating financial reports; replaced by ARC

DWR – Data Warehouse – was used for various reporting mechanisms; replaced by FDS

ECERT – Effort Certification and Reporting Technology

EZ-PO – FFE generated Purchase Order for small dollar and UwPA transactions

FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid, students complete to determine financial aid eligibility

FAS – Financial Accounting System – formerly used as the University's main accounting system; replaced by ARC.

FDS – Financial Data Store – an inventory of ARC reports; formerly DWR

FFE – Financial Front End – front end interface used to process Casual Payroll

FINSYS – Financial Systems former budgeting and cash entry module; replaced by ARC and FINERP (Financial Enterprise Reporting)

FRINGE – an additional charge to salary used to pay for employer paid benefits & related expenses. The rate is determined by the employee profile.

FWS / CWS / Workstudy – Federal (College) Work Study, part time employment for students who qualify for federal work study funds as determined by the financial aid office.

ICR – Indirect Cost Recovery, associated with sponsored grant overhead costs

IDI – Inter Departmental Invoice, used by CU departments who need to charge other CU departments for services rendered

PAD – Payroll Accounting Distribution - report formerly used to reflect breakdown of personnel salary costs as charged across FAS accounts; replaced by Labor Accounting Reports in ARC

PAF – Personnel Action Form, used to convey individual personnel data to HR/Payroll

PC – petty cash

P-Card – CU departmental purchasing credit card program

PO – Purchase Order

SAF – Salary Action Form – formerly used to convey labor information to payroll; replaced by LAF (Labor Accounting Form)

SALARY DISTRIBUTION – the process by which regular earnings for faculty and staff are allocated in the Accounting and Reporting at Columbia (ARC) system.

SPEEDCHART VALUE - an alpha-numeric shortcut that represents a full ChartString

SPA – Sponsored Project Administration (formerly Research Administration)

SPF – Sponsored Projects Finance (formerly Restricted Funds)

TBH – Transaction Based Hire; P@C module used to enter administrative and instructional hires

TBER (T&E) – Travel and Business Expense report

TEMP STAFF – individuals hired via CEIC in temporary assignments at Columbia; not regular CU employees

ZT – FFE Time Entry Module in FFE
